Many people, however, are confused about what is true Piety. False concepts of Piety make it hard to understand fully genuine and authentic piety. Some examples of persons engaging in false Piety are the Sanctimonious, the Practitioner, and the Pharisee.

The Sanctimonious person smells of candle wax and confuses sanctity with life on one's knees. He sees the world as the enemy of the soul. He looks to his own salvation and turns his backs on the salvation of others. His heart does not beat with the desire of God.

The Practitioners concentrate external acts designed to be a "safe-conduct He walks in fear because he doesn't know love. His prayers are nothing but words. He knows nothing about an inner life and has really never tried it.

The Pharisee strips his soul bare of all virtue and wears a cloak of justice on the outside. He scales the summits of human glory, which gives meaning to his virtue and zeal. His virtue does not go from the inside out.

Genuine and authentic piety exists in a life of grace with the life of Christ in us. The authentically pious person is conscious that by grace we are the sons and daughters of the Father, brothers and sisters of Christ, and living temples of the Holy Spirit.

Cursillo encourages the layperson to authentically pious person constantly grows in his relationship with Christ and this life is fully shared with others.

> The styles of authentic piety are natural, courageous, strong, and joyful. It is natural because we have the confidence of a child in its Father. It is courageous because we know that the world belongs to God. We don't fear men because we fear God. It is strong because we are willing to acknowledge the faith that we profess without blushing or caring what anyone thinks. Our attitude in prayer is straightforward and firm. We live with God's strength within us. We are joyful because our joy is truly authentic, constant, and sure. It comes from deep within us.

The pious person lifts everything up to God. He meditates on the truth of Christ realized in our own lives. The pious person frequently attends Mass and receives Holy Communion because he realizes the reality of Christ's sacrifice coming down to us, and our sacrifice being lifted up to heaven with that of Christ. The pious person makes frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle where Christ is, because He is the source of our authentic piety. There are many other forms of authentic piety that we will naturally practice as we draw closer to God and seek appropriate ways of responding to Him.

Christians As active we live Christianity deeply by knowing it, understanding it, and spreading it. Our actions speak louder than our words. We are generous and we want the best for others. We are ambitious and we won't rest until others know that God loves them also.
