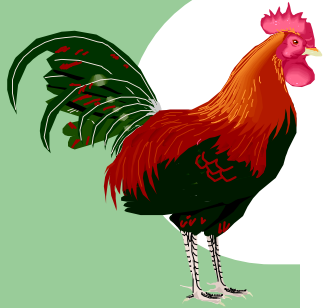

### “Christ is Our Light” - The National Cursillo Encounter by Angie Feltz



The 18<sup>th</sup> National Cursillo Encounter began on July 31<sup>st</sup> at Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. We began the encounter at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception with our opening blessing and prayer by Fr. Einer Ochoa, Cursillo Movement National Spiritual Advisor. The opening remarks welcomed 650 participants from the Lay Directors (English / Spanish) of Washington DC.

This year's theme was “Christ Is Our Light” and we heard many good talks related to our theme. Titles of the talks were Mentality of the Cursillo Movement, Total Security, Sponsorship, The Three Encounters, School of Leaders, and the Study of the Environment. On Thursday evening, we heard a remarkable talk by the Most Reverend Francisco Gonzalez, S.F., Auxiliary Bishop of Washington. He compared our Cursillo experience to that of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. “Silence, the time to look at yourself.” He told us not to make

promises but to be open to the power of the Holy Spirit. “What is God trying to tell me?”

“You are the Light of Christ!” We should look inside ourselves – before we look to the world with our light. As it is said during the Easter Vigil “Dispel the darkness”, we must continue to dispel the darkness in our own hearts and in our lives so that we are able to dispel the darkness in the world and let the “Light of Christ” shine from us for the entire world to see. As we remember the first three meditations; “Know Yourself, The Prodigal Son, and The Three Glances”, we look inside and encounter our selves where we are - in “silence.” We focus on God and His Mercy and Love for us. We were then given the opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction and Reconciliation.

Bishop Gonzalez challenged us to be realistic and to ask for the impossible. As we follow Jesus, we will believe as He did and we will become a Joyful people. We must challenge ourselves to learn more about Jesus Christ and this will result in a “self transformation,” then we can be the “Light of Christ to the World.” We will begin to transform our environments

and help others to become excited about Jesus! So remember, be His witness to the world and to let His Light shine we must be rooted in His SPIRIT and become His disciples in the world. So take time to reflect on His Love and Mercy in your life every chance you have.

Oct. 10<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for applications to the Regional Encounter to be held at St. Meinrad Archabbey in Indiana. It is open to all Cursillista.
