Secretariat Elections

Since I began living my "fourth day" in September 2001, I have tried to take an active role in this movement that has made such an impact on my life. I began attending Secretariat meetings as an observer, helping with weekends as a team member, team leader, or just helping with set-up or clean-up. Over these past nine years, I have twice served as Editor of the Rooster Crows. I actively talk to friends about the movement and have sponsored several men and women. I am always moved and revitalized at closings. I believe in Cursillo and in its people of good heart. Now is the time for those people to step up!

The Secretariat is ideally formed from the committed members of the School of Leaders. They are selected to serve the Diocesan community and propel the total work of the movement in its three phases.

Their selection to the Secretariat places them in a position of greater service to the Movement. Are you one of those people?

Three positions on the Secretariat are being vacated this year: Lay Director, the Pre-Cursillo Representative, and the English Co-Coordinator of the Three Days. Additionally a new position is being created; Co-Coordinator for the Spanish 3-Days. Beatriz Rincan already works the Spanish 3-Day position. Also, we are still looking for someone with some computer skills to take over the Rooster Crows Editor's position.

The Lay Director holds office for a term of three years and is limited to two terms of office. That individual interacts with the Regional and National Secretariats to ensure proper procedure and commitment to the movement is primary. That lead by

example and position and reports to the Bishop on an annual basis.

The Pre-Cursillo Representative serves for three years and is not limited (at present) to the number of terms served. This person is responsible for the selection and preparation of all candidates who will live a Cursillo in the Diocese.

The Co-Coordinator of the Cursillo Weekend serves for three years and is not limited (at present) to the number of terms served. This person ensures that all the necessary elements for the Cursillo Weekend are available. This includes such things as team selection (approved by the Secretariat), team preparation, overseeing of the facilities, comfort (proper nourishment and rest) and necessary supplies. This position was
